Signs of the Times: Shining Bible Light on Current Events

The Lord has wrought many blessed judgments in the world this week. The Word of the Lord provides an appropriate standard through which we may view them from a proper perspective:

Super Bowl LVIII is an event capturing the attention of millions across the world to see which team will be handed the Lombardi trophy for the next year. A fleeting treasure if you even want to call it that. "Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize? So run, that ye may obtain. And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible. I therefore so run, not as uncertainly; so fight I, not as one that beateth the air: But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway." (1 Corinthians 9:24-27) Also see Matthew 6:19-24, Matthew 19:16-22, and Luke 12:22-40. "What's wrong with enjoying a bit of football?" you may ask, seeking to justify and dissimulate. Not much by itself. However, when you start placing more significance on, giving more attention to, or attributing more prominence towards a sporting event than you do towards serving your Creator, it has become an idol to you. Flee from idolatry. 1 Corinthians 10:14.

"For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men, Teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world;" (Titus 2:11-12) Redeem the time and use what God has given to you to worship and serve Him.

"See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, Redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Wherefore be ye not unwise, but understanding what the will of the Lord is. And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess; but be filled with the Spirit;" (Ephesians 5:15-18)
