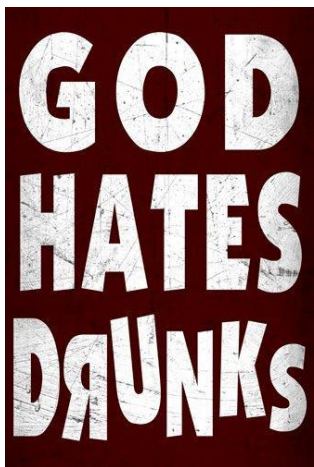

He opens for the biggest names in country music and promotes with good pay, high profile products, such as "5-hour energy". Further, he has appeared in 6 TV shows as himself, including "The Voice". One of his biggest charitable causes is American servicemen. He has hundreds of thousands of fans in the US and worldwide, that faithfully follows and supports him. He owns his own bar in Nashville, "Whiskey Row", which some of his fans frequent on a regular basis. He promotes the celebration of Christmas, and particularly, the "Elf on the Shelf". He has an estimated net worth of more than 30 million.
