## Signs of the Times: Shining Bible Light on Current Events

The Lord has wrought many blessed judgments in the world this week which can be seen plainly by any who have been given eyes to see, ears to hear, and a heart to understand by the gracious hand of God. **“Son of man, thou dwellest in the midst of a rebellious house, which have eyes to see, and see not; they have ears to hear, and hear not: for they are a rebellious house.” (Ezekiel 12:2).** This entire world is a rebellious house! Therefore, the Lord, the God of Israel, is punishing the people of it! Let’s view some of this week’s judgments from the proper perspective:

On Saturday, there were over 2,500 “No Kings” rallies, protests, and marches of various sizes across the U.S. The primary purpose of this movement was for Democrats to show their displeasure of President Trump. The “No Kings” moniker does not make much sense. The last decade shows that Americans of both parties love a president who fully wields and even abuses or exceeds his authority. They demand that authority is used to achieve their own humanly depraved desires, and there is rarely any hint of godliness in those desires. **“But the thing displeased Samuel, when they said, Give us a king to judge us. And Samuel prayed unto the LORD. And the LORD said unto Samuel, Hearken unto the voice of the people in all that they say unto thee: for they have not rejected thee, but they have rejected me, that I should not reign over them. [...] And Samuel told all the words of the LORD unto the people that asked of him a king. And he said, This will be the manner of the king that shall reign over you [...] And ye shall cry out in that day because of your king which ye shall have chosen you; and the LORD will not hear you in that day. Nevertheless the people refused to obey the voice of Samuel; and they said, Nay; but we will have a king over us.” (1 Samuel 8:6-19).**

On Monday, per the Israel-Gaza ceasefire deal, 20 Israeli hostages were released from Gaza and reunited with their families. 2,000 Palestinians were also released from Israel. In the days following the ceasefire agreement, Trump has spoken incessantly about the historic nature of “peace in the Middle East.” In a speech to Israel’s Knesset, he said, “The sun rises on a holy land that is finally at peace. A land and a region that will live, God willing, in peace for all eternity.” Meanwhile, Hamas has been killing rival groups/gangs/families in Gaza to consolidate and maintain power. Even the leader of the West Bank’s Palestinian Authority, President Mahmoud Abbas, has called this a “flagrant violation of human rights.” As part of the peace deal, Hamas is supposed to eventually disarm and give up power; it doesn’t seem like they actually intend to do that. So this is the situation we’re in: **“For they have healed the hurt of the daughter of my people slightly, saying, Peace, peace; when there is no peace.” (Jeremiah 8:11).** How can their be everlasting peace when Israel is still fully corrupt and godless? Nothing has changed in the hearts of its people. **“I hearkened and heard, but they spake not aright: no man repented him of his wickedness, saying, What have I done? every one turned to his course, as the horse rusheth into the battle. Yea, the stork in the heaven knoweth her appointed times; and the turtle and the crane and the swallow observe the time of their coming; but my people know not the judgment of the LORD. How do ye say, We are wise, and the law of the LORD is with us? Lo, certainly in vain made he it; the pen of the scribes is in vain.” (Jeremiah 8:6-8).**

On Friday, a couple things happened in the vein of corruption among our elite ruling class. George Santos, a former congressman convicted of identity theft and wire fraud related to his 2022 campaign, had his sentence commuted by President Trump. He had served less than 3 months of his 7-year prison sentence; the \$373,000 restitution he owed was also wiped away. Also, Buckingham Palace reported Prince Andrew will relinquish the use of his royal titles, including Duke of York. He will retain his title of prince. Virginia Giuffre alleged she was trafficked by Jeffrey Epstein when she was underage and raped by his friends, including Prince Andrew. **“The wicked walk on every side, when the vilest men are exalted.” (Psalm 12:8).**
